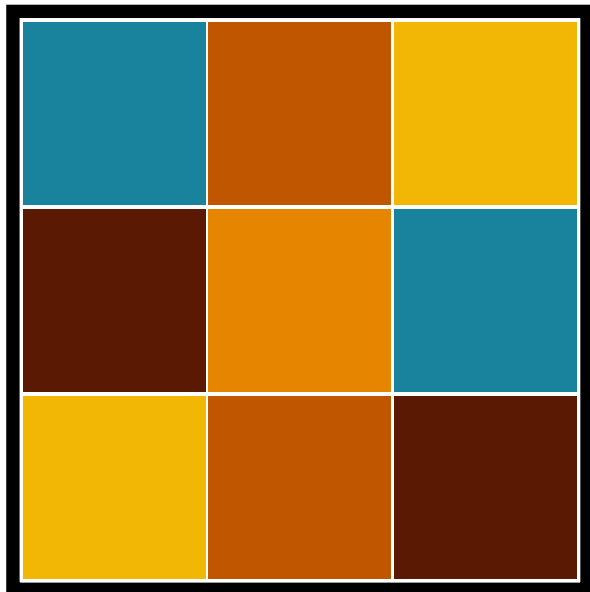
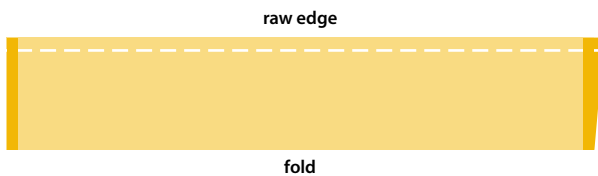


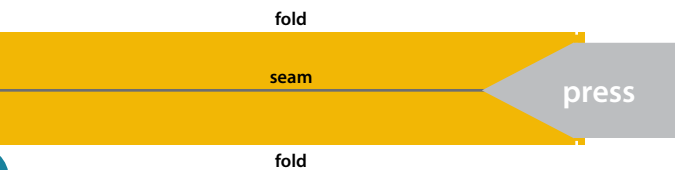
How to make a quilt sleeve



1 Measure the width of your finished quilt at the top. Cut a strip of fabric that long and 9 inches wide.



3 With right sides together, sew the strip into a long tube. Press seam flat open with iron.



4 Turn right side out. Position the seam so it runs down the center of one side and press flat.

5 Position the tube about one inch from the top of the back of your quilt with the side with the seam against your quilt to hide it.

6 Whip stitch the tube on both long sides to the back of your quilt, leaving the ends open for a hanging rod.

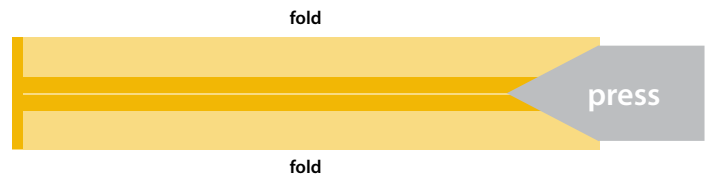
fold & press fold & press

2 Turn one short end over half an inch and press flat. Fold again half an inch and press flat. Stitch the folded edge down. Repeat on other short end.
